### Students Served by Title I, Part D, Subpart 2

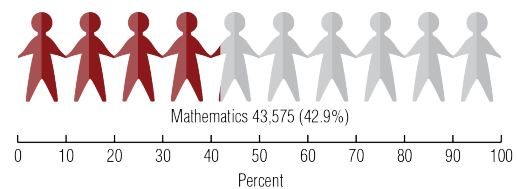
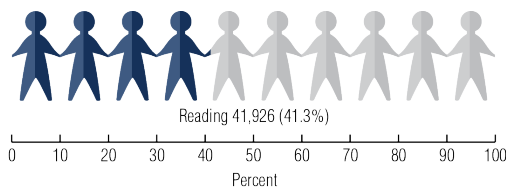
The U.S. Department of Education (ED) provides Title I, Part D, Subpart 2 (Subpart 2) funds to State Education Agencies for distribution to Local Education Agencies as additional funding for the education of youth who are neglected or delinquent. In school year 2011–12, \$141.7 million was distributed for Subpart 2 programs operated by Local Education Agencies in 46 States.

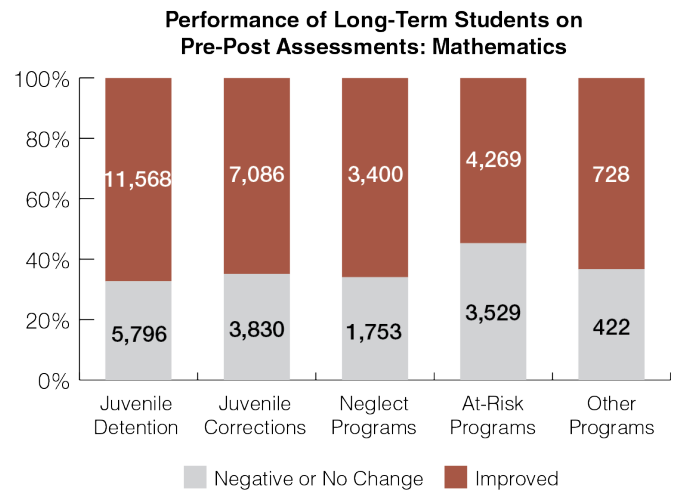
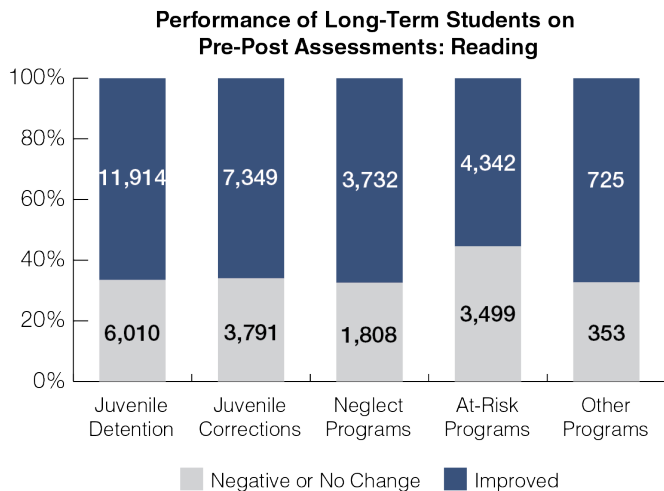
### Performance of Long-Term Students in Reading and Mathematics in Subpart 2

#### Academic Progress While in Subpart 2 Programs



Of students with available data, the majority of long-term students improved from pre- to posttest in reading (64%) and mathematics (64%) while enrolled in a Subpart 2 program (see figures above). However, many long-term students did not have complete pre-post assessment data (57% in reading; 58% in mathematics), so information on their academic progress is not available.

<sup>1</sup> Long-term students are those who were enrolled in a program for 90 consecutive calendar days or longer.

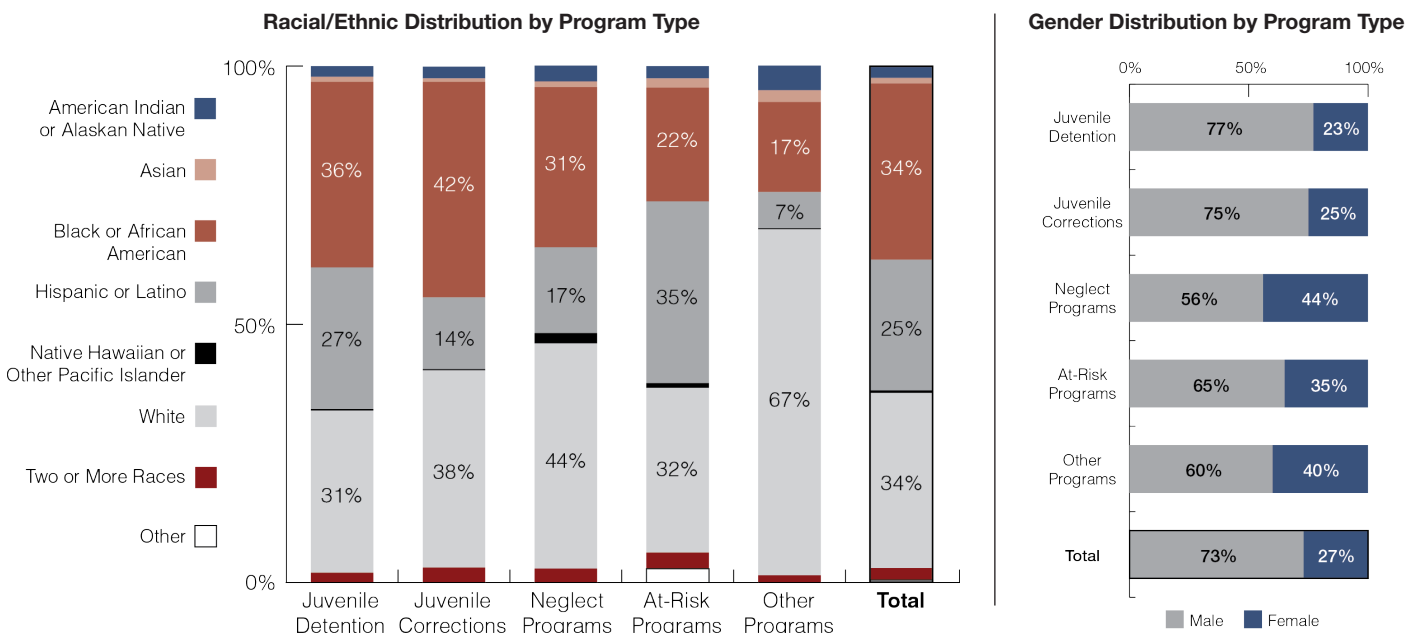
